

A **PUBLIC HEARING** was held by the Torrington Board of Councilmen in the City Hall Auditorium on Monday, May 20, 2019, to solicit citizen input regarding proposed changes to City Ordinance Chapter 194, "Vehicles and Traffic." Present were Mayor Elinor Carbone, Corporation Counsel Victor Muschell, and City Councilors Frank Rubino, Paul Cavagnero, Gregg Cogswell, and Fred Simon. City Councilors Marie Soliani and Anne Ruwet were absent. Public Works Director Raymond Drew, Comptroller Alice Proulx, Purchasing Agent Pennie Zucco, Deputy Comptroller Gina Casper, Treasurer Daniel Farley, Fleet Manager Emil Castro, and Traffic Division Officer Steven Pisarski were also present.

Mayor Carbone called the Public Hearing to order at 6:30 p.m. beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Clerk Carol Anderson read the legal notice.

Tom Kandefer pointed out some details that he believed had been overlooked in the proposed ordinance including redundant or inconsistent language, insufficient definitions, and the lack of equal exceptions to all permittees.
