Dear Council Members,

NW CT Community Foundation received 54 Applications totaling \$2,883,555 in requests for the Community Impact Grant, funded by the City of Torrington's American Rescue Plan Act Funds. The total amount allocated to round 1 of the Community Impact Grant was \$875,000.

The ARPA Advisory Committee has performed a detailed review of all applications requesting \$15,000 or less and is scheduled to review the remaining applications over the next several weeks.
