We would like to recommend awarding RFP #ATR-005-081418 Oil Tank Removal Armory Building to Kropp Environmental Contractors, Inc., for the turnkey operation for removal and disposal of the existing 3,000 gallon underground oil tank, removal of remaining oil in tank, removal of the fill lines, etc. We would also recommend awarding the charges associated with the oil transfer, cost of removal/disposal of any contaminated soil (if necessary), and the two alternates for concrete removal and site restoration.

This project will be funded from Fund 91 "LoCIP Public Act Proceeds".

No. 2 Heating Oil Release

Brushmill by the Waterfall Restaurant, Chester, Connecticut

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

- ✓ *Controlled downstream migration of heating oil.*
- ✓ *Recovered 18,000 gallons of oil-contaminated stream water.*
- ✓ *Restaurant operations never affected by clean-up activities.*

Kropp Environmental Contractors responded to a release of No. 2 heating oil to the Pattaconk Brook, immediately downstream of Pattaconk Dam No. 3, resulting from a failed heating oil feed to the boiler for the restaurant, located directly above the brook. The released heating oil (estimated to be in excess of 100 gallons) migrated a short distance across the boiler room floor before spilling into Pattaconk Brook and migrating downstream several hundred feet. Kropp deployed multiple response team personnel to place absorbent booms across the

brook at a number of locations to limit downstream migration. The team recovered the heating oil contained by the booms and affected leaf litter using multiple vacuum trucks. These clean-up activities extended well into the night and never affected restaurant operations.

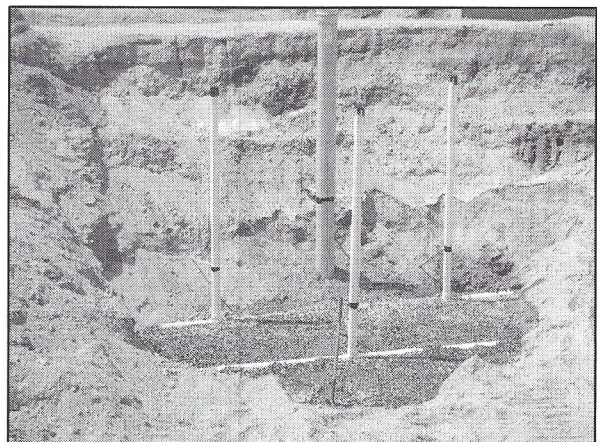

Kropp Environmental Contractors was retained by the Connecticut Department of Correction to excavate contaminated soil after a diesel release resulting from deteriorated underground feed pipes from an aboveground storage tank. After initial investigation, Kropp discovered the extent of contamination was larger than expected and immediately began groundwater monitoring and recovery to ensure that a nearby 1,000,000-gallon per day public water supply well field was not affected.

Kropp installed over 40 groundwater monitoring and recovery wells to monitor and limit the migration of the oil-contaminated groundwater plume. Kropp vacuumed free product and diesel-impacted groundwater from the recovery wells and utility vaults.

Kropp excavated and disposed of approximately 750 tons of contaminated soil from the affected area and replaced it with clean fill and a passive soil vapor recovery system. Kropp ensured all Department of Correction procedures were followed and provided continuous updates to the affected stakeholders and regulatory agencies.

Kropp Environmental Contractors is centrally located close to many major highways, which allows us to respond to vehicular accidents throughout Connecticut

On Connecticut Route 8 in Thompson, a gasoline tanker lost control and rolled down an embankment, coming to rest upside down. Approximately 5,000 gallons of gasoline was released into a pristine wetland area as a result. Kropp applied an in-situ groundwater remediation treatment and restored the area with clean fill material.

On Interstate 95 in Groton, a No. 2 heating oil delivery truck lost control and crashed. The tank detached from the cab and chassis and came to rest in the breakdown lane of the interstate, releasing an estimated 1,250 gallons of oil. The local fire department had placed an earthen berm along the drainage ditch to the side of the interstate to contain the release. Kropp vacuumed the tank and puddles of heating oil using a power vacuum truck. The Connecticut Department of Transportation and State Police kept the lane adjacent to the breakdown lane closed while Kropp excavated contaminated soil using a mini-excavator. Kropp coordinated with four other trucking companies to bring roll-off containers of contaminated soil to a disposal facility.

In the rural neighborhoods of Franklin, Kropp responds to incidents involving milk, which is hazardous to aquatic environments. Kropp has responded to various incidents involving milk tankers, including one on Connecticut Route 2 in Hartford and one in Bozrah.
