J. Brett Simmons, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation would like to recommend awarding a bid for the Timber Harvest at Charlene Susan Besse Park to Gutchess Lumber Company. Gutchess Lumber Company submitted a bid in the amount of \$56,982.00 (revenue.) Andrew Bosse, the City's current Forester of Record, will oversee a Timber Harvest Project at Charlene Susan Besse Park, at a rate of 20% (\$11,396.40) of the timber sale. The City of Torrington entered into contract with Mr. Bosse in January of 2019, after receiving approval from City Council. Mr. Bosse also oversaw the Timber Harvest at Alvord Park. The City of Torrington will net \$45,585.60 from the timber sale, which will be invested back into the park for park improvements.

Request for Proposal

INVITATION TO BID ON STANDING TIMBER on the CITY OF TORRINGTON'S CHARLENE SUSAN BESSE PARK PROPERTY TORRINGTON, CT

Showing date: November 10, 2020 10:00 a.m.

Bid due date: November 24, 2020 5:00 p.m.

You are invited to submit a bid for the purchase of the marked timber on the Charlene Susan Besse Park property owned by the City of Torrington, CT. There are 1,733 trees marked for harvest, with an estimated volume of 360,333 board feet (International ¼" rule). The Group Selection harvest method (a.k.a. "Patch Cuts") was utilized for this project, and include twenty-four ¾ acre groups across the property (see attached map) within which all trees must be cut except those marked with an orange "S", which are designated to remain in place and undamaged. There is also marked timber in the areas outside the Groups, including 1,342 cull trees marked for removal. For a breakdown of the tally by species, please refer to the attached table, (Attachment A). While the volumes were estimated with the utmost care, they are not guaranteed since utilization practices vary. Each bidder is urged to make their own determination of the volume.

The sale area is comprised of approximately 110 acres, with the total area of the property being approximately 100 acres. The timber is marked with blue paint, and the property boundaries are marked with pink flagging. Group area boundaries are marked with orange paint and flagging. The project staging area is located at the parking lot at the end of the gated park driveway off of Riverside Drive in Torrington. See attached map, (Attachment B), for further details.

Project Specifications:

- 1) All work done during this project will be under the direction of the Project Forester, Andrew Bosse.
- 2) All marked trees must be cut. All sawtimber trees of merchantable size (8' and longer, 10" tip and greater) and all pole timber trees of merchantable size (16' and longer, 4" diameter and larger) must be removed from the property.
- 3) In the Group Selection areas, all stems 2" and greater must be cut excepting the reserve trees marked with an orange "S" and boundary trees marked with orange paint.
- 4) All tops and slash must be lopped to four feet or less. No tops, slash or debris may be left in the flagged logging trails, existing hiking trails, any streams, within 50 feet of the driveway or within 25' of the property boundary.

- 5) The City of Torrington is interested in possibly having the logging slash/debris removed from the patch cut areas and the property in general. Please include in your bids, if capable and interested, an itemized cost for this additional work.
- 6) An excavator is required for trail improvement and/or remediation at the end of the project. Main logging trails shown on the attached map must be left in a condition suitable for use by a UTV (as may be required for emergency services).
- 7) Portable bridges will be required for stream crossings.
- 8) Appropriate erosion control measures as directed by the project forester and specified in the "<u>Best Management Practices for water quality while harvesting forest products</u> 2012 CT Field Guide" must be utilized throughout the duration of the project.
- 9) At the conclusion of the project, the staging area and logging trails must be cleared of any logs, slash, or debris, regraded, and water bars installed as directed by the project forester. The contractor must also provide 100 lbs. of conservation grass seed mix which will be spread by the project forester.

Prospective bidders may view the timber on the showing date listed above or by appointment. The meeting place for the site visit will be at the gated driveway across from #600 Riverside Avenue (Logan Steel). Please do not enter the property without making prior arrangements with the supervising forester.

Send **BIDS** by email (preferred), mail, or hand delivery at the Project Forester's office, (address listed on letterhead). Please include an email address to which the bid results can be sent. <u>The Seller reserves the right to reject any or all bids</u>. The successful bidder ("Purchaser") will be notified by phone and/or email and will be required to enter into a "Forest Products Sale Agreement" (copies of which are available upon request) within 10 business days.

The term of the Agreement will be for a period of 18 months but will be extendable for reasons of inclement weather and unfavorable ground conditions. Payments will be required as follows: 25% due at signing; 25% due at the start of harvest, but no later than September 1, 2021; and the remaining 50% is due when, in the opinion of the supervising forester, half of the marked timber has been cut. A performance bond of \$3,000 is required prior to the commencement of any activity on the Seller's property. All payments must be in the form of a certified bank check or money order. Proof of general liability insurance coverage (a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 liability and \$250,000.00 property damage) will be required of the successful bidder and all subcontractors. The policy must also list the Seller and Andrew Bosse as additional insured. Purchaser must also provide proof of workman's compensation insurance. All logging subcontractors must be appropriately licensed by the State of CT DEEP Forestry and approved by the SELLER'S Agent. Purchaser must provide a one-week notice before beginning logging operations in order for the supervising forester to determine the suitability of the ground conditions.


