A **REGULAR MEETING** of the City Council and Water Pollution Control Authority (WPCA) of the City of Torrington was held at the City Hall Auditorium on Monday, May 16, 2022. Present at the City Hall auditorium were Mayor Carbone, Police Chief William Baldwin, Economic Development Director Rista Malanca, WPCA Administrator Ed Tousey, Building Committee Chair Edward Arum, City Councilors Keri Hoehne, Armand Maniccia, and Paul Cavagnero. Corporation Counsel Victor Muschell, Attorney Jaime LaMere, Public Works Director Ray Drew, and Councilors Drake Waldron and David Oliver joined via Zoom. Councilor Anne Ruwet was absent.

Mayor Carbone called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment

On a motion by Councilor Cavagnero, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to open the meeting to the public.

Ray Bottass shared his thoughts regarding the road conditions in town.

<u>Stephen Ivain</u> shared his concerns regarding the Drug Recognition Expert that the Police Department must hire.

Approve Minutes

On a motion by Councilor Maniccia, seconded by Councilor Hoehne, the Council voted unanimously to accept the Public Hearing meeting minutes from May 2, 2022.

On a motion by Councilor Maniccia, seconded by Councilor Waldron, the Council voted unanimously to accept the meeting minutes from May 2, 2022.

On a motion by Councilor Hoehne, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted to accept the Joint meeting minutes with the Board of Public Safety from May 9, 2022. Councilor Cavagnero abstained. On a motion by Councilor Waldron, seconded by Councilor Maniccia0 the Council voted to accept the Special Budget meeting minutes from May 9, 2022. Councilor Cavagnero abstained.

Drug Recognition Expert

On a motion by Councilor Waldron, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to authorize the Personnel Director to enter into an MOU between the City and Police Union Local 442, regarding the use of Drug Recognition Experts as per CGS PA 21-1 Section 119. Chief Baldwin explained that the Drug Recognition Expert Program that the State has enacted is to get Officers trained to recognize people driving under the influence of narcotics and or alcohol. Right now, all the Officers are going through advanced field sobriety test training. DREs can test individuals for being under the influence of other drugs, including alcohol. The goal for Torrington is to have three to five certified DREs. Any fatal or serious motor vehicle accident is required to have a DRE report to the scene. Torrington currently has one DRE, if they are not available the City can reach out to other local agencies to assist in the investigation. Councilor Maniccia asked what the goal was for the Police Department with the DRE, Chief Baldwin said that he would like the DRE assigned to the accident investigation team. Councilor Hoehne asked how many serious or fatal accidents Torrington had last year, Chief Baldwin didn't have an exact number but said about five or six, but year over year they are increasing. Councilor Cavagnero asked if the DRE is in response to the State legalizing recreational marijuana, Chief Baldwin said that the DRE does have the ability to test for other narcotics and not just blood alcohol content. Chief Baldwin went on to explain that the DRE test takes 2-6 hours to administer. Councilor Oliver asked if we are seeing an uptick in arrests due to under the influence of marijuana, Chief Baldwin said at this point not yet. Councilor Hoehne asked Atty. LaMere if she was part of the contract negotiations and if it was like what other towns are doing with their DREs. Attorney LaMere said that this type of contract is normal.

NAA Public Hearing

On a motion by Councilor Cavagnero, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to schedule a Public Hearing on Monday, June 6, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. to review, discuss and solicit citizen input regarding proposals for participation in the 2022 Neighborhood Assistance Act Program.

Sewer User Fee

On a motion by Councilor Hoehne, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to schedule a subsequent Public Hearing, herein acting as the Water Pollution Control Authority on June 6, 2022, to set the Sewer User Fee for the period from July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023. Councilor Cavagnero wanted to know how they were defining all other users on the fee schedule, WPCA Administrator Ed Tousey explained that these are commercial accounts.

Food Truck Ordinance

On a motion by Councilor Cavagnero, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Ordinance Committee, and schedule a subsequent Public Hearing on June 6, 2022.

Out of State Motor Vehicle Ordinance

On a motion by Councilor Oliver, seconded by Councilor Cavagnero, the Council voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Ordinance Committee, and schedule a subsequent Public Hearing on June 6, 2022.

Resolution #143-229

On a motion by Councilor Maniccia, seconded by Councilor Oliver, the Council voted 3 to 2, with Councilor Hoehne and Councilor Cavagnero opposed, in favor of adopting Resolution #143-229 for a \$500,000 Urban Action Bond, for 100 Franklin St, Torrington Riverfront (Pennrose). Councilor Cavagnero expressed his opposition to this taxpayer-funded grant for a for-profit business. Councilor Hoehne agreed with what Councilor Cavagnero said, and also asked if the City had put any additional requirements on Pennrose that they needed to apply for this grant. Economic Director Rista Malanca stated that the city did not and that the main reason for the grant was cost escalation due to COVID. Ms. Malanca went on the explain that this puts a lien on the Pennrose property for 35 years, which ensures that they continue to provide the high-quality building that had been promised. Resolution #143-230

On a motion by Councilor Cavagnero, seconded by Councilor Maniccia, the Council voted unanimously to adopt Resolution #143-230 for a \$1,000,000 Brownfield Remediation grant for 245 E. Elm St, Vinny's Restaurant. Mayor Carbone explained that this is the first time in all the Brownfield Grants where the state is looking for matching funds or security interest. Once the remediation is complete the security funds will be released back to the company. Economic Director Rista Malanca explained further that the state is looking for this because they want to make sure that after the remediation is done that the property doesn't just sit there, they want to ensure that it gets developed. Ms. Malanca said that the owner's plans for Vinny's are to open a banquet facility. See addendum 2.

Independent Code Review

On an amended motion by Councilor Waldron, seconded by Councilor Hoehne, the Council voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of the Torrington High School Building Committee, to approve the services of Versteeg Associates of Torrington, CT to be the consultant for Torrington's Independent Code Review for the Middle/High School/Central Administration Construction Project, for a lump sum of \$46,500, contingent on Board of Education approval.

Traver Invoice Payment Authorizations

On a motion by Councilor Maniccia, seconded by Councilor Hoehne, the City Council herein acting as the Water Pollution Control Authority, voted unanimously to approve the following payments to Traver IDC, Inc. of Waterbury CT from Fund #491 WPCA Infrastructure Upgrade. Councilor Cavagnero asked why they were broken into separate payments and wanted to know if this project was complete. WPCA Administrator Ed Tousey explained that this project is completed and that the invoices came in separately for the work done.
