A “**VIRTUAL**” **PUBLIC HEARING** of the City Council & WPC Authority was held on Monday, October 5, 2020 to solicit citizen input regarding the acceptance and acquisition of Sanitary Sewers on Tarringford Street at Putter Lane as public sewers. Pursuant to the Governor’s Executive Order No. 7B, there was no physical location. Members of the public were encouraged to submit their comments in writing to the City Clerk’s Office prior to the start of the public hearing. City Council members and the public were able to attend the meeting remotely using the ZOOM online meeting platform.

The meeting was attended in-person by Mayor Elinor Carbone, Corporation Counsel Victor Muschell, City Treasurer Daniel Farley, Public Works Director Ray Drew, Acting WPCA Administrator Ed Tousey, Public Works Superintendent Bill Mayers, Assistant Superintendent of Streets Tim Cote and City Councilors Frank Rubino, Drake Waldron and Sharon Waagner. City Councilors Paul Cavagnero and Anne Ruwet joined by ZOOM. Councilman David Oliver was absent.

Mayor Carbone called the Public Hearing to order at 6:31 p.m. beginning with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Assistant City Clerk Jonathan Draper read the legal notice that was published on the City’s website and in the *Republican-American* newspaper on September 24, 2020.

Public Comments

Mr. Draper reported that the City Clerk’s office did not receive any written comments from the public regarding the proposed sewer extension. Mr. Drew explained that the project could support future development of a large parcel of land to the north of Putter Lane.
