Failure to acknowledge this Addendum by the Bidder may result in the rejection of their bid. Bidders are directed to review changes to all portions of the work as changes to one portion may affect the work of another.

## INFORMATION FOR BIDDERS

### **17. SUBCONTRACTS:**

The successful Bidder must submit in writing to the City for its review and approval the names of any person, firm, or other party it proposes as subcontractors. If the proposed subcontractors are found to be acceptable, then the City will issue approval in writing. Any subcontractor not approved by the City in writing shall not be used.

The bidder is specifically advised that any person, firm, or other party to whom it is proposed to award a subcontract under this contract must be acceptable to the City, and submit the following forms prior to work on the site:

- a) "Certification of Proposed Subcontractor Regarding Equal Employment Opportunity"
- b) "Non-Collusion Affidavit of Subcontractor"
- c) "Subcontractor's Certification Concerning Labor Standards and Prevailing Wage Requirements"
- d) Subcontractor Certification Regarding OSHA in accordance with 29 CFR 1910.268. A current Statement from the State of CT treasurer that to the best of his/her knowledge and belief, as of the date of the statement, the particular party was not liable to the State for any workers' compensation payments made pursuant to C.G.S. section 31-355.

Although the bidder is not required to attach such Certifications by proposed subcontractors to his bid, the bidder is hereby advised of this requirement so that appropriate action can be taken to prevent subsequent delay in contract and subcontract awards and notices to proceed.

Approval of the proposed subcontract award cannot be given by the City unless and until the proposed contractor has submitted the certification forms and/or other evidence showing that it has fully complied with any reporting and compliance requirements to which it is or was subject.

### **18. WAGE RATES:**

#### **STATE PREVAILING WAGE RATES APPLY**

- a) Wage rates, establishing the minimum rates, issued by the State of Connecticut Labor Department and Contractor's Wage Certification Form, a copy of which is attached, is made a part of this contract. The Contractor shall submit with his/her bid a completed, notarized Contractor's Wage Certification form. This form is found in the Section "C", with the other contract forms.
- b) Pursuant to the State of Connecticut Public Act 93-392, the bidder shall submit a certified payroll record, utilizing the form furnished with the prevailing wage rates included in these specifications. The certified payroll shall be submitted on a weekly basis with a "Statement of Compliance" to the contracting agency included on the reverse side of the payroll form.
- c) Apprentices may be employed at less than predetermined rates if they are in an apprenticeship program registered with the Department of Labor or with a state apprenticeship agency recognized by the Department. Trainees may be employed at less than predetermined rates if they are in a training program certified by the Department.
- d) Contractors and subcontractors on prime contracts in excess of \$100,000 are required, pursuant to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, to pay employees one and one-half times their basic rates of pay for all hours over 40 worked on covered contract work in a work week.
