

**MINUTES  
PUBLIC HEARING  
CITY COUNCIL  
ONLINE (ZOOM)  
February 1, 2021**

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A **“VIRTUAL” PUBLIC HEARING** of the Board of Councilmen was held on Monday, February 1, 2021 to solicit citizen input regarding the creation of a noise ordinance. Pursuant to the Governor’s Executive Order No. 7B, there was no physical location for the public hearing. Members of the public were encouraged to submit their comments in writing to the City Clerk’s Office prior to the start of the public hearing. City Council members and the public were able to attend the meeting remotely using the ZOOM online meeting platform.

The meeting was attended by Mayor Elinor Carbone, Corporation Counsel Victor Muschell and City Councilors Frank Rubino, Anne Ruwet, Sharon Waagner, Paul Cavagnero and Drake Waldron. Councilman David Oliver was absent.

Mayor Carbone called the public hearing to order at 6:34 p.m.

Assistant City Clerk Jonathan Draper read the legal notice that was published on the City’s website on January 22, 2021, in accordance with the Governor’s Executive Order No. 7I, Section 19 (c).
